
# Ezra

Amorites enemy of Israel living in Canaan Ammonites descendants of Lot living in land adjacent to Moab Artaxerxes a king of Persia during the time of Ezra and Nehemiah Benjamin tribe descended from Jacob's twelfth son Canaanites various tribes living in Canaan Cyrus a king of Persia who allows the Jews to return to their homeland Darius a king of Persia Ezra a priest, scribe and teacher, he returns to Jerusalem to help rebuild the Jewish community; his insistence on maintaining the Jewish ethnic community and its distinctive tradition survive to this day Haggai a prophet active after the exile in Babylon Hittites ancient tribe living in Canaan Jebusites inhabitants of the ancient city of Jebus, which later becomes Jerusalem Judah tribe descended from Jacob's fourth son Levi/Levites descendants of Jacob's third son Mithredath Cyrus' treasurer Moabites descendants of Lot living in land adjacent to Ammon Mordecai a Jewish leader that is not to be confused the prominent figure in the book of Esther Nehemiah after returning to Jerusalem to rebuild its walls, he becomes the governor of Judah Perizzites descendants of Perez, a son of Judah Sheshbazzar the governor of Judah Xerxes a Persian king Zechariah a prophet contemporary with Ezra Zerubbabel one of the leaders who begins rebuilding of temple, he is an ancestor of Christ

### TERMS

Feast of Unleavened Bread a seven-day celebration, beginning with Passover, in which only unleavened bread is eaten to commemorate that the Hebrew women had no time to let their bread rise as they hastily fled Egypt during the Exodus; occurs during the first month of the Jewish year (March/April) Feast of Tabernacles a celebration lasting seven days during the harvest season in which the people live in shelters reminiscent of their days of living in tents in the Wilderness; the celebration begins on the 15th day of the seventh month of the Jewish year (September/October) holy set apart for God's use governor ruler of an area who is subordinate to the ruler of a larger area encompassing the first Persia empire roughly encompassing modern Iran; defeats Babylon and set Judeans free, allowing them to return to their homeland royal satrap governor Temple of the Lord the building where Israel worshipped and offered sacrifices to God
