ometimes called *Song of Solomon*, this book has been interpreted a number of ways, including that it is:

- 1. an allegory describing:
 - God's love for Israel, or
 - Christ's love for the church, or
 - Christ's love for the soul
- 2. <u>wisdom literature</u>, giving wisdom's description of an ideal relationship between husband and wife (the *Bible* elsewhere describes love as a gift of God, to be received with gratitude and celebration)
- 3. a love song from Solomon to a peasant girl, possibly his first wife
- 4. a combination of one or more of the above.

PEOPLE

concubine a secondary but legal wife, who was sometimes a servant of another wife; sometimes purchased or received as the spoils of war **myrrh** a gum resin with a pleasing odor; used in perfume and anointing oil
