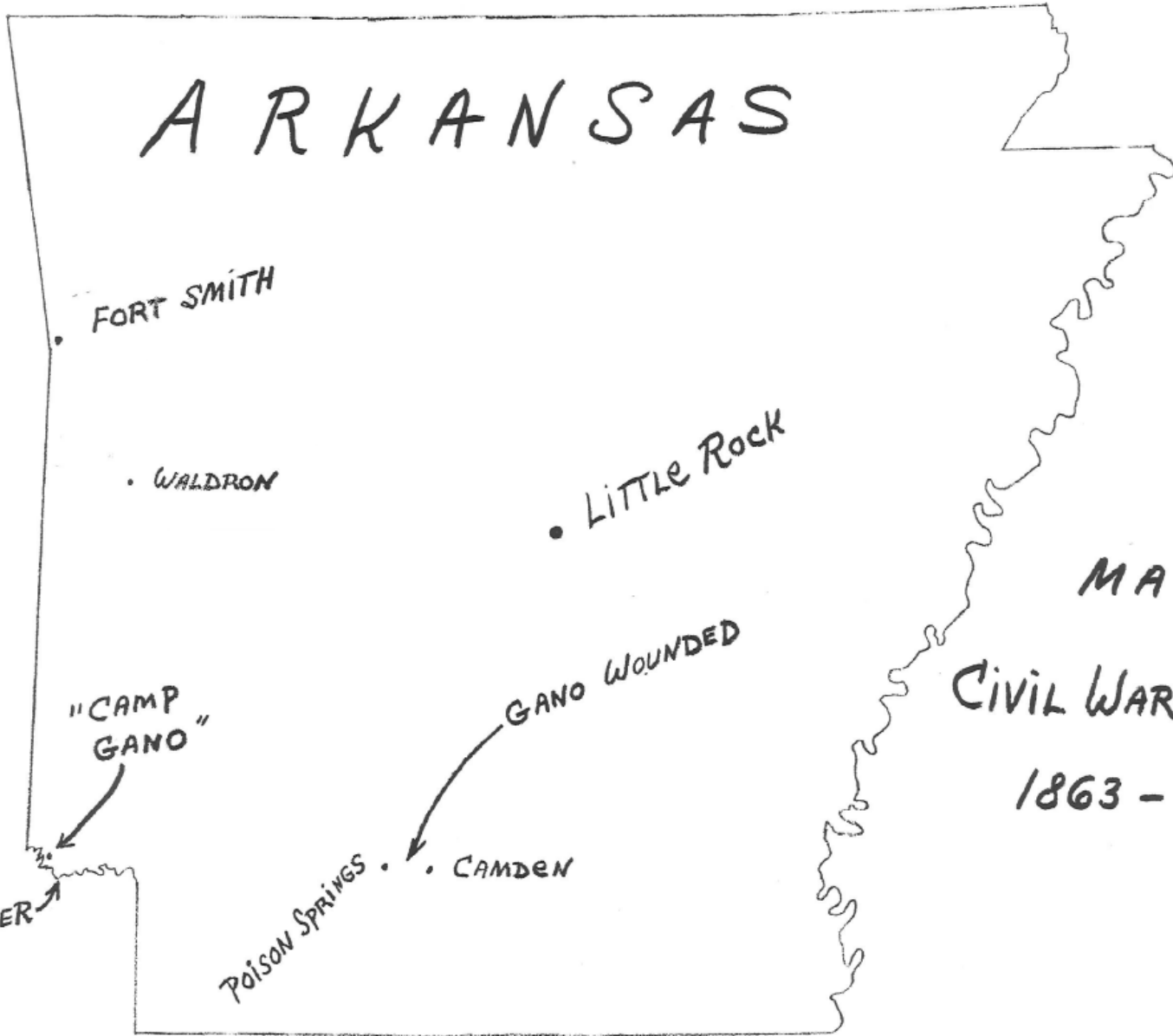

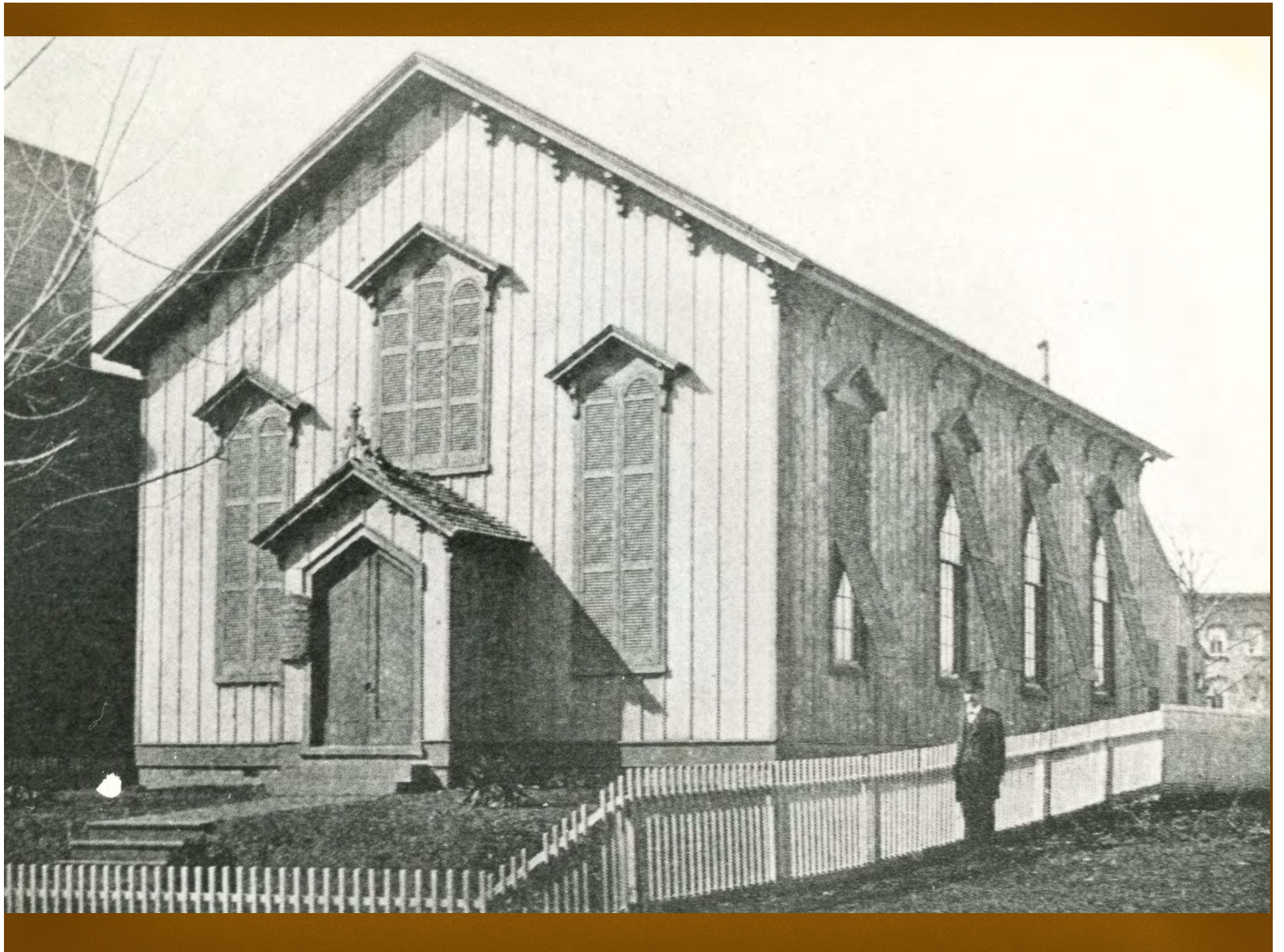

Committee on Military Affairs, House of Representatives, 1867–1869. Front center: Chairman Garfield.

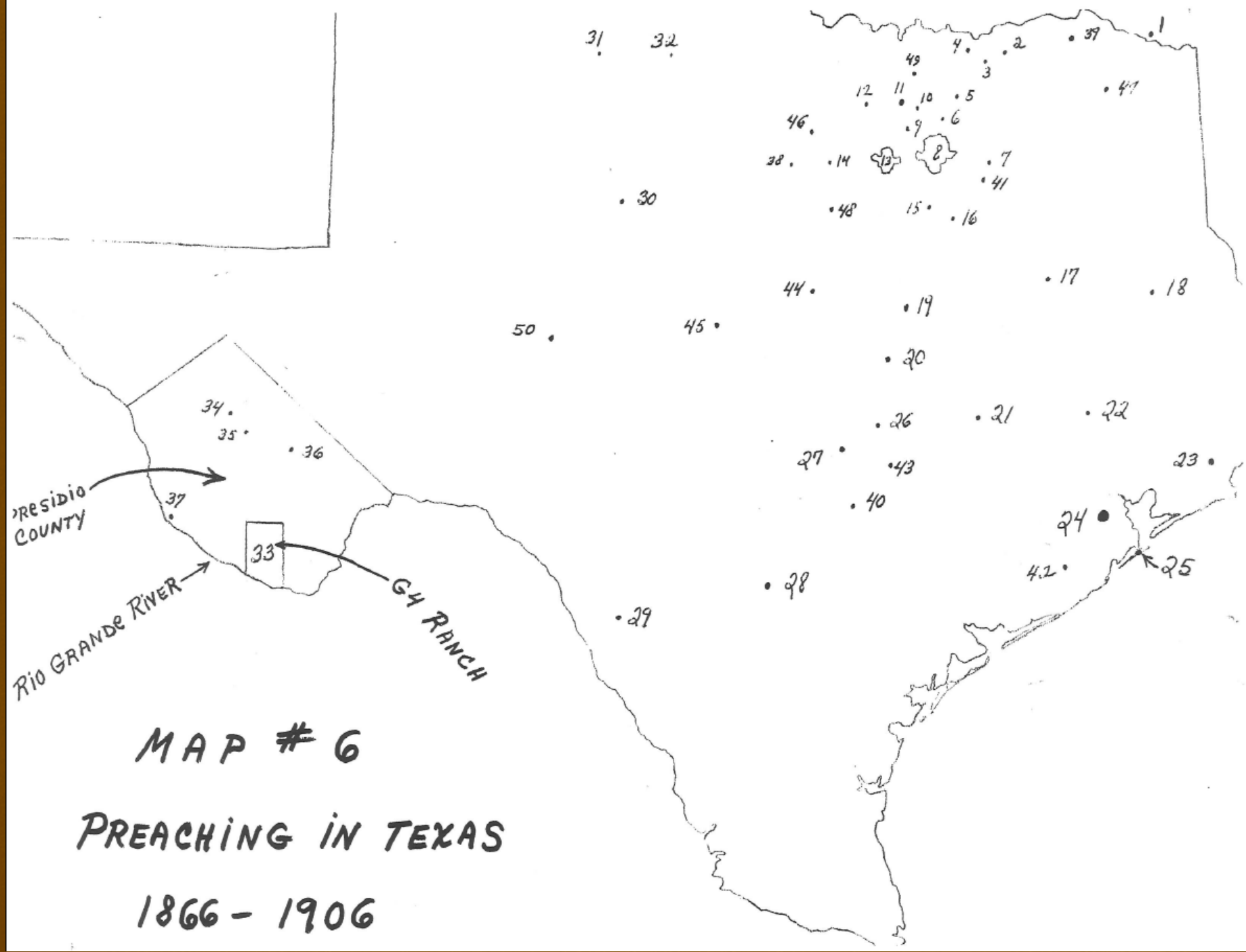




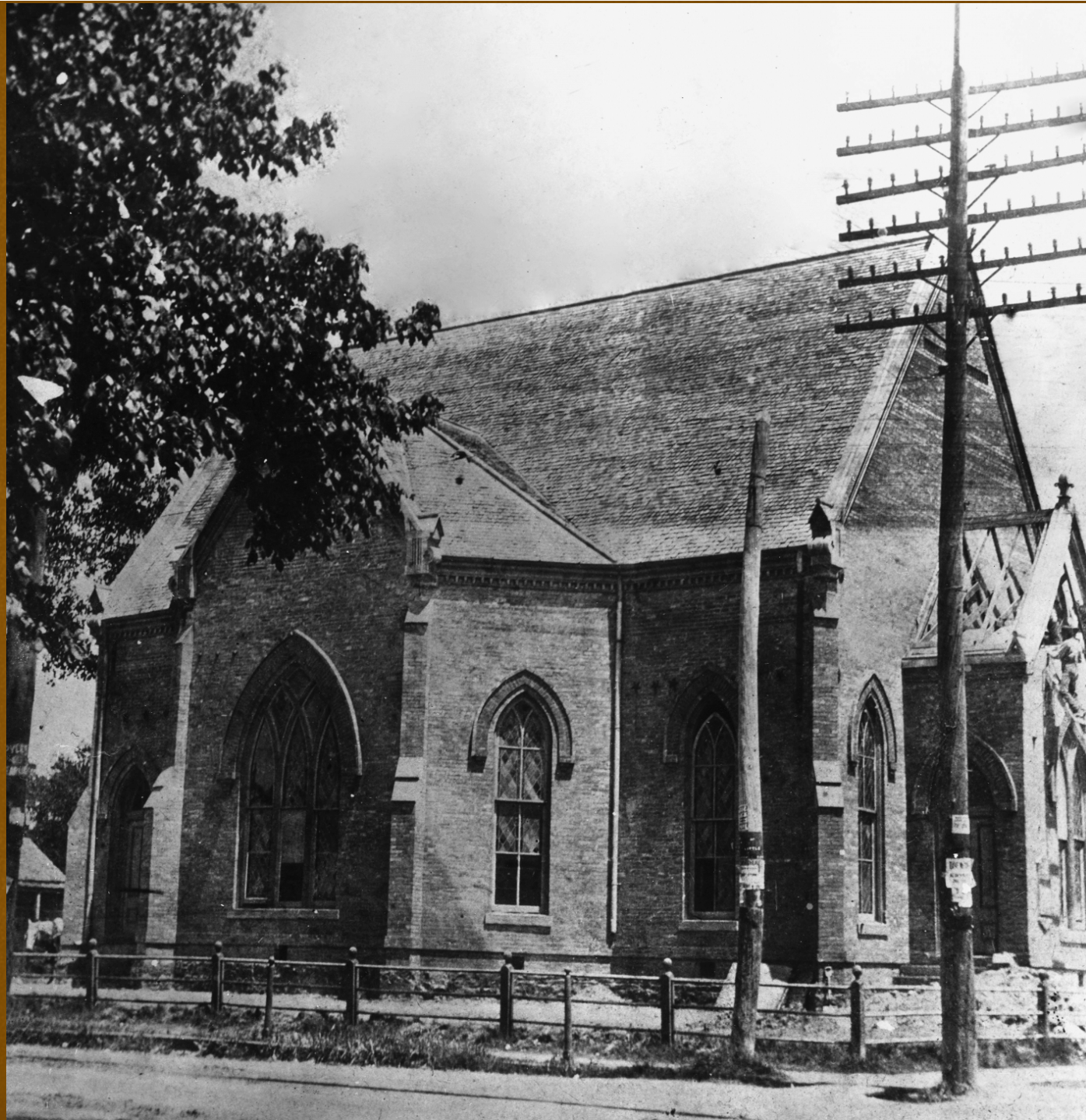

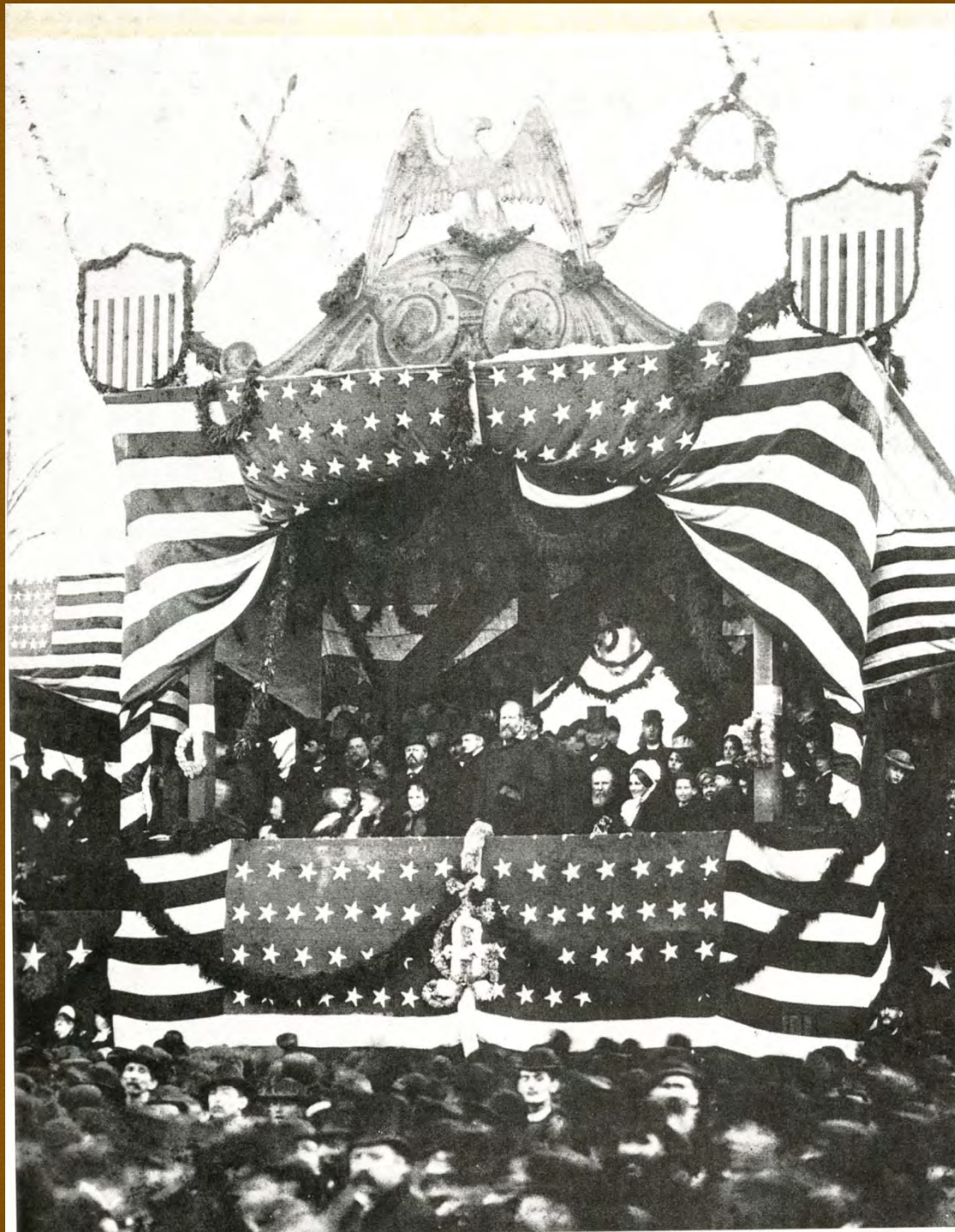

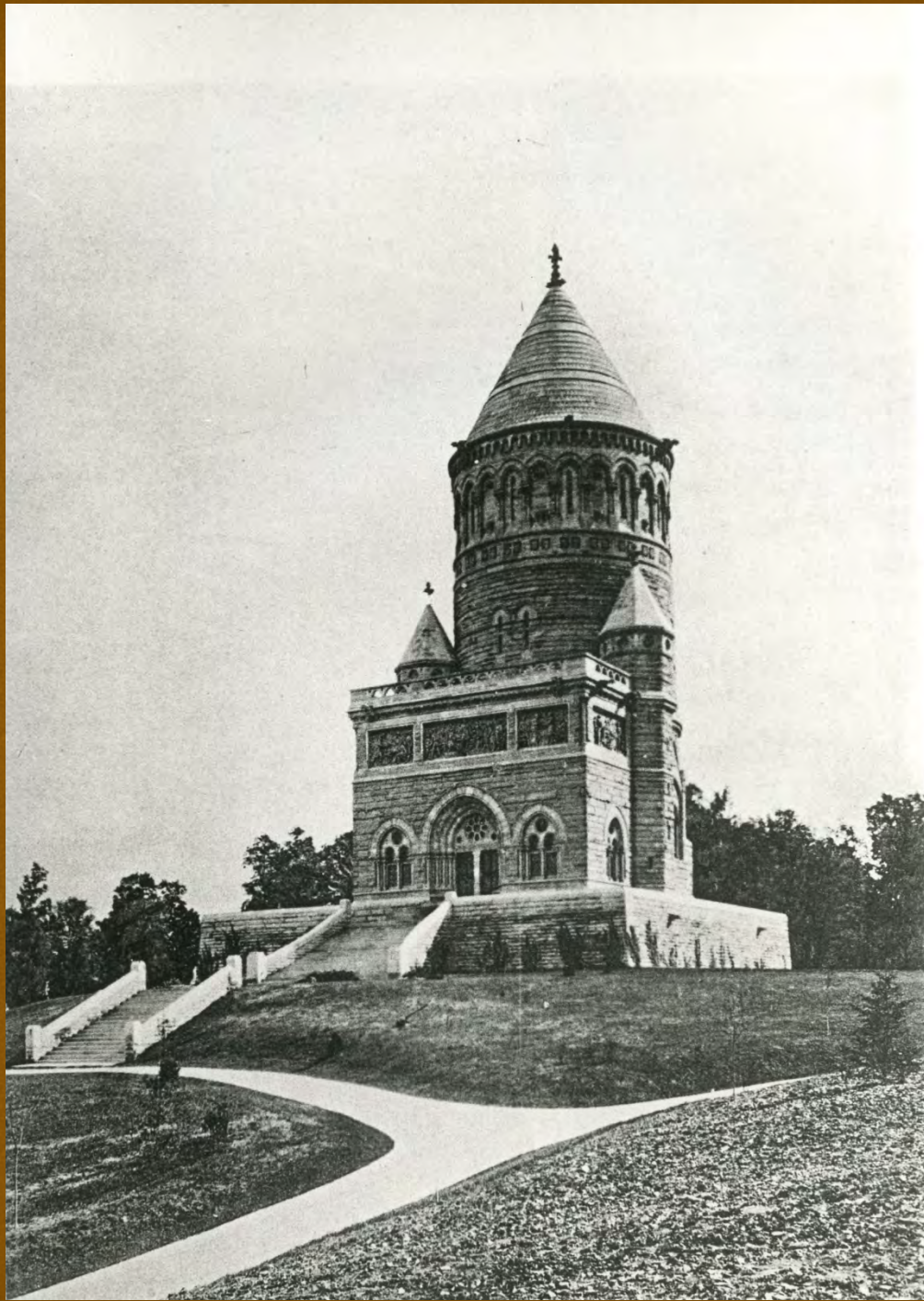








The White House in mourning, following the assassination of President James A. Garfield, 1881 (Library of Congress)

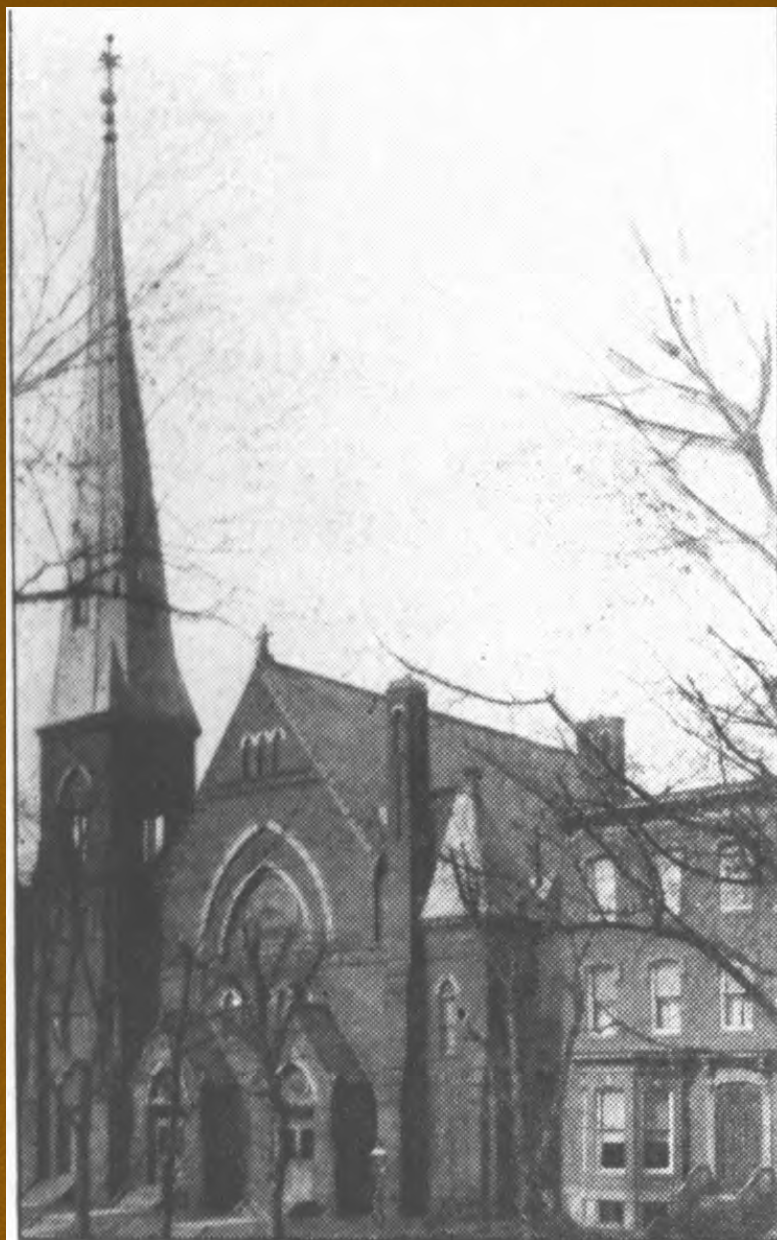

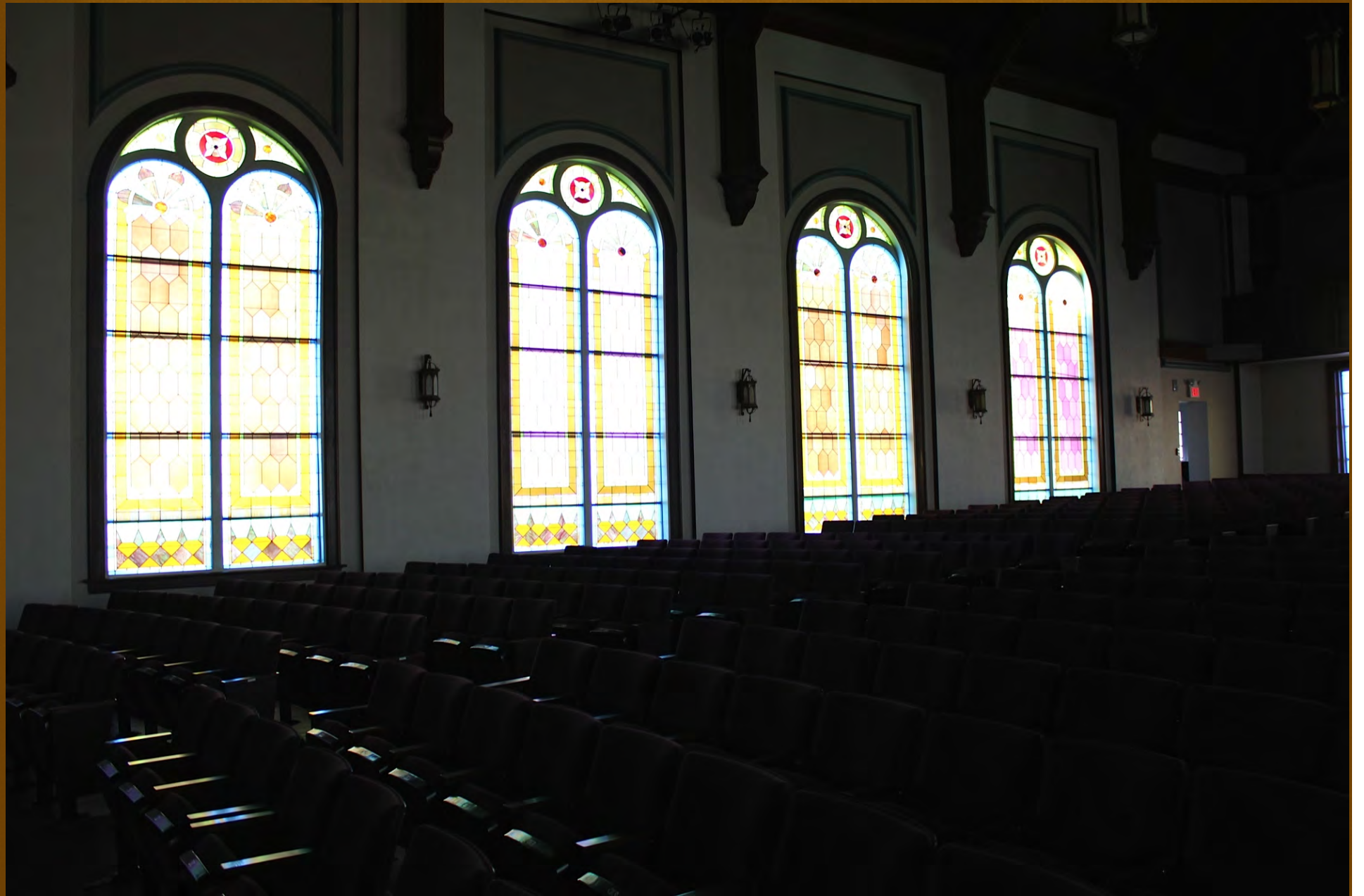


Vermont Avenue Church

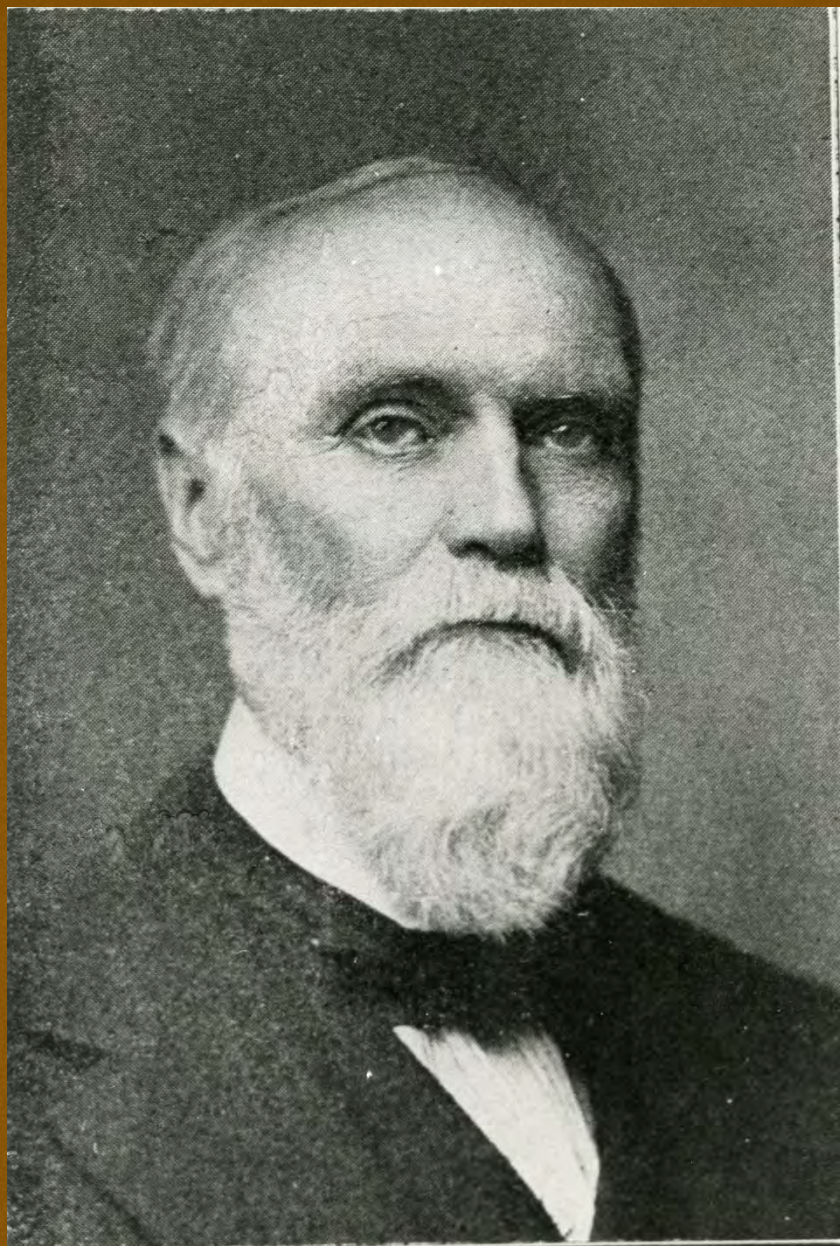

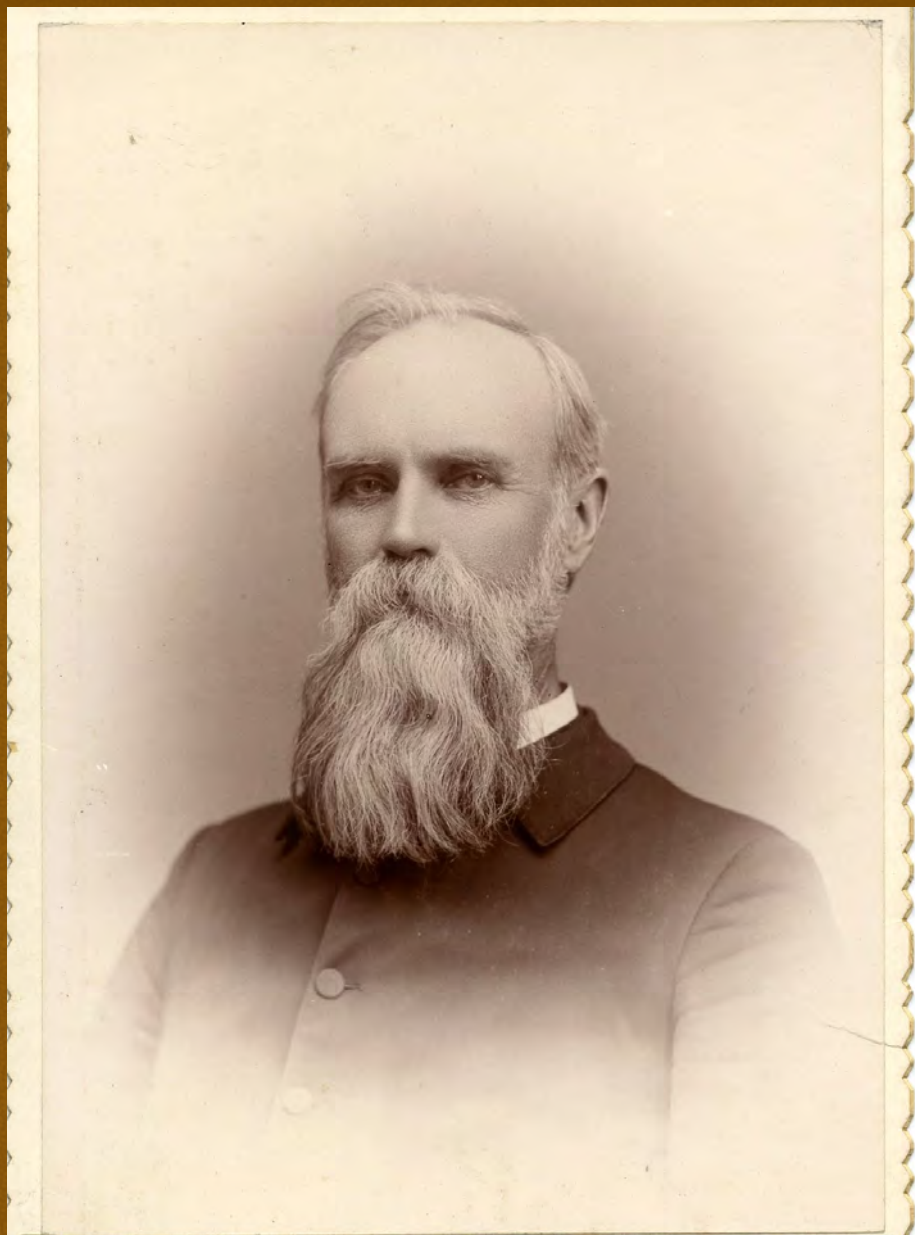

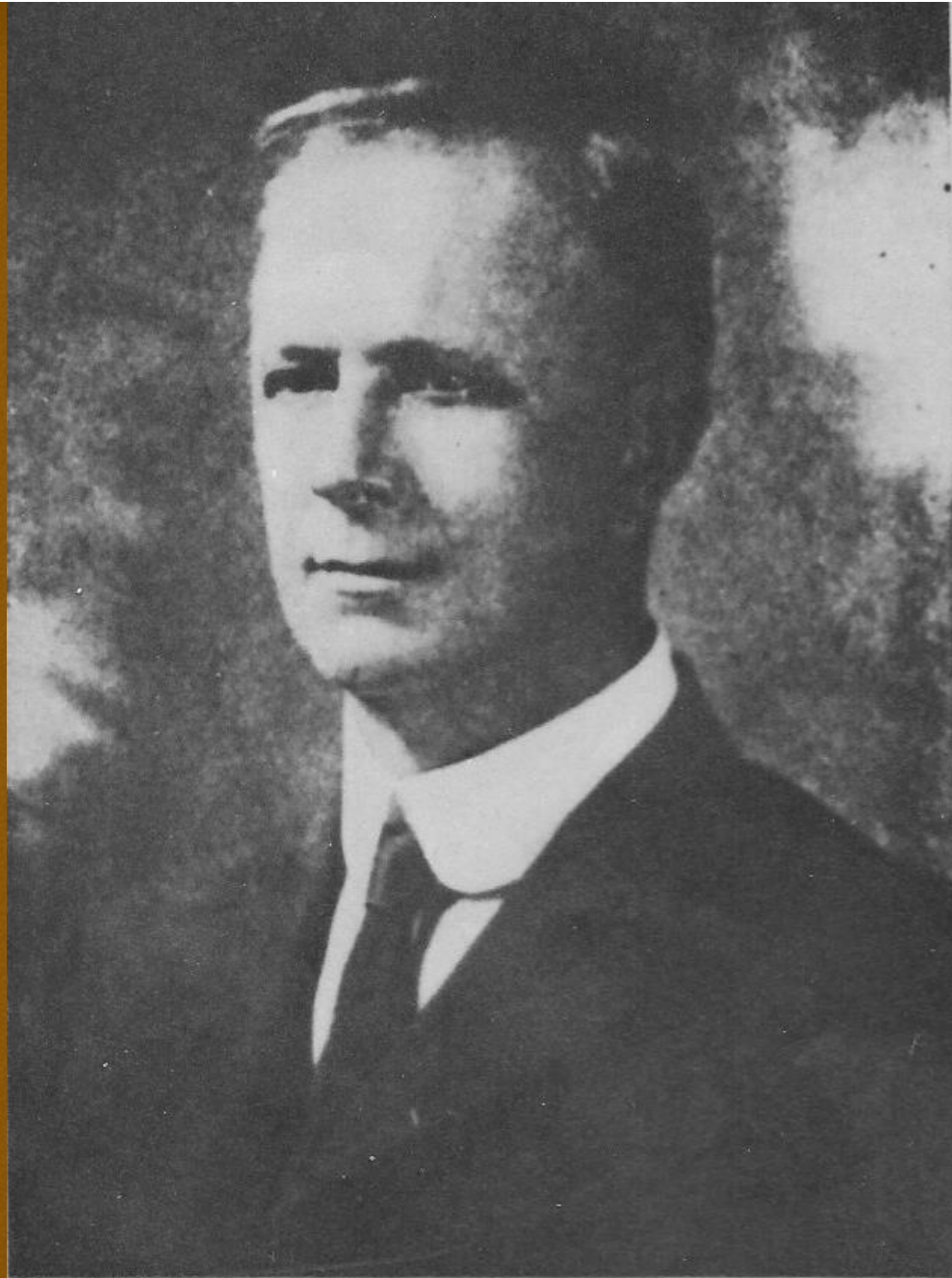
