New York, May 1, 2023—Chief Judge Debra Ann Livingston of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit announced today that the Court of Appeals will appoint Patrick G. Radel as a United States Bankruptcy Judge for the Northern District of New York in Albany. Mr. Radel will officially assume his duties on June 1, 2023, in a private ceremony.
